

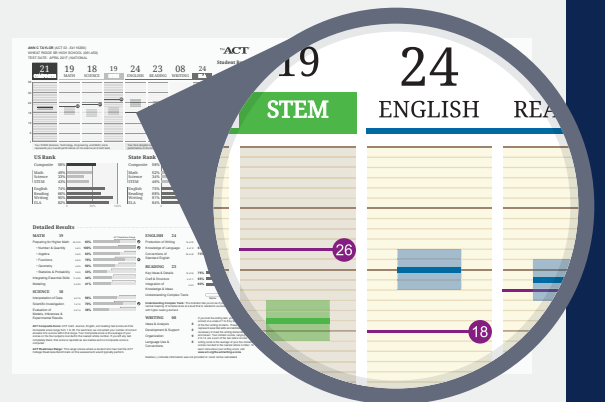
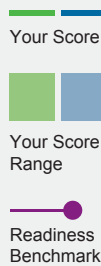
4 Things to Know About the 2016–17 ACT® Test Score Reports

Beginning in September 2016, we've enhanced our score reports to help students get the most from their test results. Here are some highlights:

1 Am I college ready?

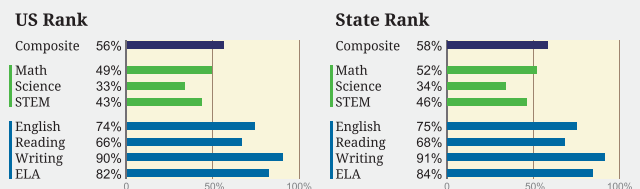
The ACT College Readiness Benchmarks aren't new but we've made them easier to read.

Scoring at or above the benchmark means you have at least a 50% chance of getting a B or higher or about a 75% chance of getting a C or higher in a first-year college class in the corresponding subject area.



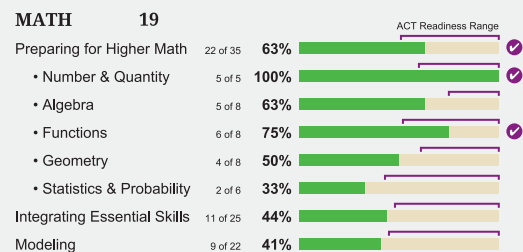
2 Where do I rank?

This section shows the approximate percentage of recent grads who took the ACT and received scores that are the same or lower than yours.



3 Where can I improve?

The ACT Readiness Range visualizes areas where you excel and helps you find opportunities for improvement.

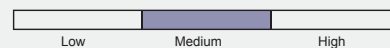


4 Does my major fit?

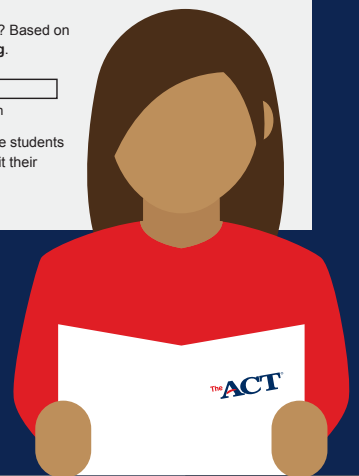
Learn if your interests are similar to those of students who actually chose the major you're considering.
