- Whether the teacher has met state qualification and licensing criteria for the grade level and subject areas taught;
- Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or temporary status in which State qualifications or licensing criteria are waived;
- The teacher's baccalaureate degree major, graduate certification, and field of discipline; and
- Whether the student is provided services by paraprofessionals, and if so, their qualifications.

We will also provide notifications to parents of students in Title I schools if their child has been assigned to be taught, or has been taught for four or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not highly qualified (currently all of our teachers are highly qualified).

Parents also receive information on the level of achievement of the student in each of the state's academic assessments via parent reports for each state test given to students. Parents also receive results for the Terra Nova Test given in late fall to students in grade 3 and the In-View exam given to students in grade 4.
